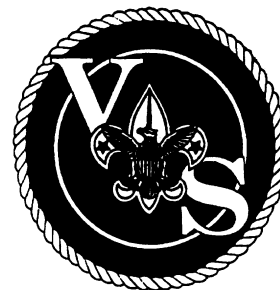

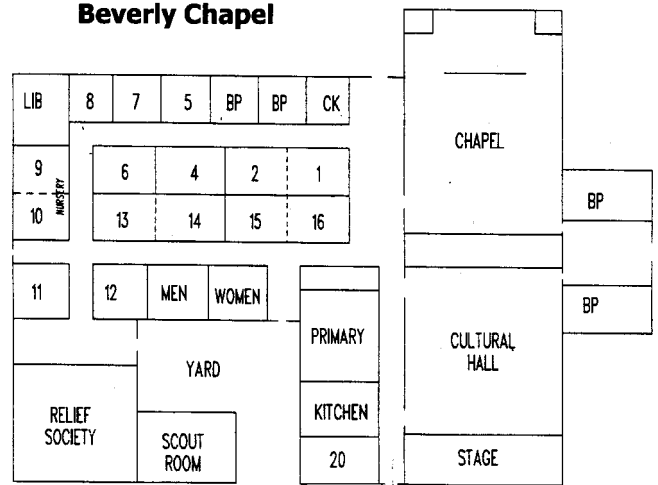

THE AIMS AND METHODS OF SCOUTING

AIMS:

1. To build character- a complex of mental and ethical traits; self-reliance, self-discipline, self-confidence, and self-respect.
2. To foster citizenship- a behavior in terms of the duties, obligations, privileges, and functions of a citizen.
3. To develop fitness: **PHYSICAL**; **MENTAL** - leaders must make certain that activities challenge scouts to be curious, stay alert, ask questions, get the facts and then make decisions; **EMOTIONAL** - Skill and courage to adjust and learn to live with problems they can do little to solve, the self-control not to fly off-the-handle when something goes wrong, and the self-discipline not to be arrogant when something goes right; **MORAL** - the courage to do what his head and heart tell him is right, and the courage to refuse to do what his head and heart say is wrong.

METHODS:

1. Ideals - personal behavior guides and standard to which the boy is committed. The motto, the slogan, the Scout Oath, and the Scout Law.
2. Patrols - reinforce feelings of belonging, broadens the sharing of responsibility.
3. Outdoors - fund, develop sensitivity to nature and environment.
4. Advancement - measures growth, encourages growth, encourages self-esteem.
5. Personal Growth - service, good turns, religious emblems
6. Adult Associations - with adults (male and female) of high character is encouraged.
7. Leadership Development - Things to remember:
 1. It's the boy's troop
 2. Don't encourage them to do things that are not planned.
 3. Don't do everything for them.
 4. Allow them to fail - evaluate - do again - to succeed.
8. The Uniform - Its OK to buy a new one when the old one is too small.
